Objective & Management



Objective:Contribute to regional cooperation and
development, by promoting business cooperation
between Israeli, Jordanian and U.S. companies
through projects with significant R&D content

Management: Managed by the BIRD team, using similar procedures and with minimal overhead


Principles



- Project performed by three companies, one from each country
- Conditional grant up to 50% of project budget; other funding provided by the participating companies
- Project ends in a functioning system and/or marketable product, which produces revenues
- Pilots or β-sites possible revenues based on final system
- Grant is repaid only from revenues from the project, at 5% rate;
- Maximum repayment is 150% of grant

Key Events in TRIDE's Evolution



- 6/1996 Announcement of TRIDE as a pilot initiative; Initial \$1 M funding approved; 1st Executive Committee appointed
- 11/1996 First 2 TRIDE projects approved
- ✓ 10/1999 3rd TRIDE project approved
- ✓ 12/2005 2nd round of funding completed \$1M
- ✓ 9/2007 1st Project (second round) approved
- ✓ 2009 2nd and 3rd Projects (second round) approved
- ✓ **2012** 3rd round of funding \$2M (working for approval)

Project Evaluation




Each proposal submitted to TRIDE is reviewed and graded, independently, by 3 professional reviewers, one from each country:

- A reviewer from the American National Institute of Standards & Technology (NIST)
- A reviewer from the Office of the Israeli Chief Scientist (OCS)
- A reviewer from the Jordanian Royal Scientific Society (RSS)



Procedures in Applying for a TRIDE Project





Areas of Interest - Examples



- Water efficiency, reuse, desalination of brackish sources, etc.
- Energy efficiency, renewables, etc.
- Agriculture in hot and dry areas
- Communication systems
- ✓ Software systems
- Healthcare systems

Economic/Social Benefits



- Funding is leveraged by the partnerships to produce significant revenues and high level jobs
- Opening of markets that are hard to reach otherwise
- Promoting business relationships between Jordanian and Israelis with US backing
- Platform that can be expanded to much larger joint projects, by using TRIDE to fund a pilot or a β-site
- Proven model which can be used for other regional partnerships

Summary



 TRIDE is an excellent vehicle for regional cooperation, encouraging Jordanian and Israeli industry people to work together, backed by strong U.S. support

 The Jordanian and Israeli Governments have committed continued funding; the U.S. support is now being discussed
